Reading- Students are working on summarizing their mystery book chapters by talking about: characters, setting, story events, a problem, a solution, and how the chapter ends.

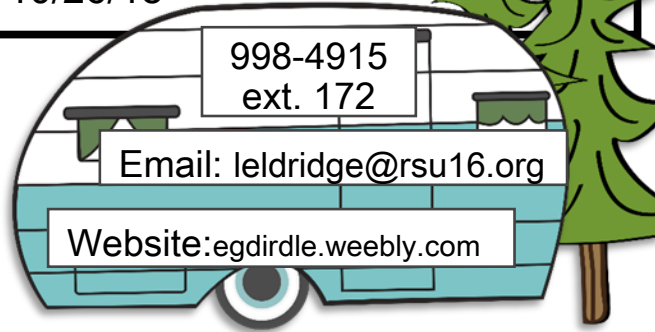
Spelling- Next week we will work on short vowel patterns i, o, and u.

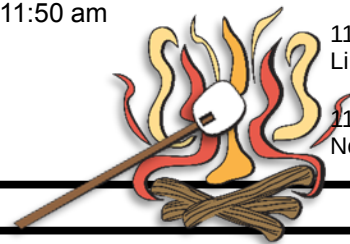

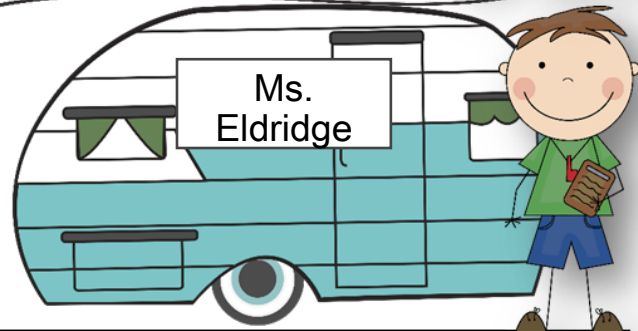

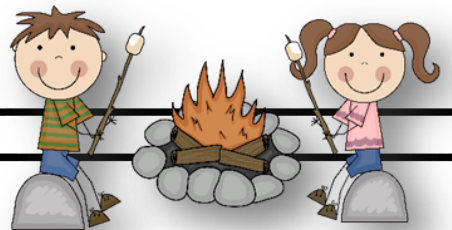


Scholastic Book Fair 11/2/18-11/8/18
