






Multiplication Strategies:

Adding a Group
Fact: 6 × 3 = ?
Helper Fact: 5 × 3 = 15

×××
×××
I add one group of 3.
×××
15+3=18
×××
6 × 3 = 18

Strategy: Subtracting a Group

Example: $9 \times 6 = ?$ Helper fact: $10 \times 6 = 60$ I start with 10 groups of 6.
I subtract 1 group of 6 to find 9 groups of 6. 60 - 6 = 54, so $9 \times 6 = 54$.
